It has been a bit since I have communicated with you and boy, have things been busy around your Sea Breeze School!

Summer Camp started for us on June 20 and has been so much fun! We have an average of 86 children enrolled each week and after a few tears on Monday mornings, they are all off and running. The children have enjoyed a FOAM Party when the children had the opportunity to run in and out of organic solution that made the largest amounts of foam, a visit from the Bubble Lady when the children were put inside huge bubbles and Create Mix and Mingle when each child was taught to draw an individual portrait. We are still waiting for visits from the Bird Lady and the Insect Discovery Lab. Thankfully I will be off campus for the bug visit since bugs are not my favorite thing in the world, although the children will LOVE them.

A very exciting thing happened for Sea Breeze this Summer. We were finally able to install a flag pole on campus! This has been a goal of mine since I started 10 years ago and I am so pleased to see it come to life. Please feel free to visit the end of the courtyard where you will find a 20 foot pole with both the American Flag and the Episcopal Flag illuminated and flying proudly. We have put flowers around the bottom of the pole and a small decorative fence around the entire area to protect it from our little friends. During the School Year, the entire school routinely meets to build our community and recite the Pledge of Allegiance, sing patriotic songs, recognize birthdays and hear announcements regarding upcoming school events. Historically, this event has been held in the courtyard with children holding small flags and moving forward we will all now be able gather around our beautiful flag that will fly 24 hours a day as long as the weather permits it.

When arriving to Church, you may have noticed a large white van in the parking lot, this is now commonly known as the Sea Breeze Bus! As we continue to build our After School program, we have decided to expand our pick-up abilities and will now use this van to transport children in grades K-4 from Foster City Elementary Schools to our campus for extended care. When the new Elementary School opened last year, we lost several children due to the re-districting of students. While we knew this would impact us, we have been surprised by the number of children that now attend the new school. If you see the van going around town, give a big wave! Thank you to Father Jason for spending your day off, driving the van to us from Orange County.

Summer Camp ends on August 11 and the 2023-24 School Year officially starts on August 21. We do still a few openings in our classrooms, so if you know anyone looking for a great place to be child please send them our way!

We are looking to a very busy and eventful School Year and your continued support.
